

MOTORCYCLE GUIDELINES & APPLICATION

Revised and updated: December 2014

ALL USE OF THE MOTORCYCLES WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE RESIDENTIAL MANAGER

All Students must comply with the following guidelines whilst riding motorcycles on the College Site.

1. Motorcycle Operations

- Participants shall provide written consent from their parents, or guardians before participation is permitted.
- Participants must demonstrate an understanding and competence in the use of the equipment along with a willingness to adhere to all instructions that may be given.
- All students must ride motorcycles in a safe and responsible manner.
- Students must ride in an anti-clockwise direction only.
- Students are only to ride on the motorbike track.
- Permission must be gained from an on duty Residential staff member before commencing motorcycle riding.
- Students are only to engage in riding on the College motorcycle track unless express permission is given.
- **A minimum of three students are to be present at the motorbike track at all times.**
- Motorcycles must be ridden in a slow and safe manner from the motorcycle shed to the motorcycle track.
- All riders must walk their machine across all roads.
- If required motorcycles may be washed down adjacent to the farm workshop. This area is to be kept clean.
- Students are responsible for the cleanliness of motorcycle shed and surrounds.
- The owner may only ride the motorcycle unless permission has been given in writing from both parent/ guardians.
- No motorcycle over 250cc two stroke or 450cc four stroke is to be ridden on the College site.
- All participants are required to wear suitable safety equipment, including a correctly sized and fitted helmet, safety goggles (or visor) and gloves that comply with appropriate Australian standards.
- All participants shall wear suitable clothing when riding a motorcycle.

The minimum required standards for clothing are:

- Enclosed footwear
- Long trousers
- Long sleeve shirt

2. Equipment Safety & Management

- The Motorcycle Club Co-ordinator will inspect all equipment and machinery at the start of each term to ensure it is in a safe operating condition, in accordance with relevant standards and manufacturers instruction.
- All students motorcycles must be stored in the locked motorcycle shed when not in use.
- Fuel must only be stored in the locked motorcycle shed.

3. Course Safety & Management

- Safety barriers shall, wherever practical, be erected around any immovable obstructions/obstacles to reduce the risk of impact related injury.
- The course shall be kept free of obstruction, hazardous material and rubbish.
- No unauthorised students will be permitted access to the motorcycle course, without the approval of the Motorcycle Co-ordinator or Residential Staff.
- Person/s affected by medications or substances will not be permitted to ride motorcycles on the College sites.

4. Other

- Competition based racing or time trials are not sanctioned by these guidelines.
- Operational times are between 4.15pm – 5.30pm (Monday-Thursday).
- Weekends are at the discretion of the staff but students must be back at the College by 5.30pm always.

All Riders ride at their own risk. The College is not liable for any injury or damage caused as result of an accident.

It is advised that the parent/guardian look into insurance cover for their son/daughter.
