

ATAR Exams/Year 12 General Finish times

PARENTS - PLEASE NOTE: End of term is not the finish date for Year 12 students. If after the Year 12 rehearsal (Tuesday 20 September 4.00pm) students have completed and have a fully signed off Clearance Form they will be allowed to leave. Those students who have not completed all of the required academic or practical work will return in Term 4.

Please be aware if Year 12's are returning to complete certain areas they can only be at the College for that designated time e.g. Farm, they can only return on the Wednesday afternoon ready for classes on the Thursday and the same would go for the Trade area. Class area they would return on the Sunday night for classes Monday and Tuesday. There may be some negotiation for the Wednesday as to which areas students may be able to go to. Any students who needs to complete work in all areas spend the week at College the as per normal timetable. The reason for this is that the College still has Year 11 students in normal classes and we cannot have students in areas with Year II's. All returns must be negotiated with the Deputy Principal.

For Year 12 ATAR students, the first week of Term Four is

compulsory as they will be attending a camp in Perth. Week 2 and 3 is optional as they are Study Weeks and students are welcome to stay at the College during exams which finish on the 4 November.



August at the College

The canola crops are in full flower and looking really impressive. They have possibly received a little damage to some flowers with heavy frosts early in the month. All crops generally are looking very promising, unlike the market prices for grain. The world grain prices, as everyone is aware, are not looking particularly encouraging but we are all hoping that the yield will cover these price shortfalls. Frost still poses a risk, but some things we cannot do anything about. Mr Childs has had students spreading urea for a nitrogen top up on the cereal crops and this has now been completed. Crops are being monitored for disease but so far we seem to be fairly clear of any major disease impact.

Mr Laird has been busy with students marking and mulesing lambs and the lambing percentages have been very encouraging with our best mob achieving 115% lambing and the worst 95%. The first draft of the Poll Dorset prime lambs have been drafted off and will be sent off to market next week. We will be expecting a price in the \$120 per head range. All sheep are looking in fantastic condition with good amounts of feed being available since April. Mr Laird and **Mrs** lles have been providing a lot of training with the students in preparation for a large number of competitions

coming up this Term, including WA State Sheep Handling Challenge at Katanning, the Corrigin Show, the Koorda the Perth Show, Royal Agricultural Show and Farm Skills Competition. Speaking of Farm Skills, training is well underway with students in preparation for the 15 events that students will compete in at the Claremont Showgrounds on Thursday 22 September. Mr **Dumbrell** is also coaching students in preparation for the fencing competition at the Dowerin Field Day on 24 August.

The cows have started calving and at this point 6 calves are on the ground and with the amount of feed around, it's guite difficult to spot the calves as the feed is so high. Mr Byrnes has the feedlot up and running this Term and students are gaining lots of experience and knowledge in the operation of a commercial feedlot, which has been run by the students under the watchful eye of Mr Byrnes. Mr Byrnes will be taking a team of students to compete in the Junior Cattle Judging Competition at the Beverley Show and one of the events at the Farm Skills Event will be a judging competition as well.

Miss Davey has had students busy building a new enclosure in the paddock for the mated sows which includes a dome shelter, electric fencing and water supply. This will give more space for the sows and segregation ability for the different age groups of the Preparations are well sows. underway for the piggery display on Open Day, which will be held on Friday 9 September. Mr Frantom has been busy in the Butcher Shop with the new smoker oven producing high quality products for the kitchen. He has also established a vegetable garden at the front of the butcher shop which has been producing some fantastic produce used by the kitchen staff.

Mr Ball has commenced a new project in the workshop area building a calf catching cage which attaches to the side of the ute to enable new calves to be captured and then marked with little risk to students from angry overprotective mothers! Although not yet completed, this is scheduled to be in use in the next week or so and Mr Byrnes is looking forward to using this new piece of machinery.

Mr Longmire is very pleased with the progress of the Year 12 students as most, if not all have finished their Certificate II in Agriculture and the Certificate III students are progressing well. Year II students are starting to achieve competencies towards their Certificate II as well. Mr **Jones** has had a strong focus on assisting Year II students in achieving their Stage 2 College Driving Licences. There are some students that are still requiring more practice at this stage, which Mr Jones is continuing to assist.
