#### Please Note:

Students enrolled in a Year 12 ATAR course must sit the external examination in that course. If students do not sit an ATAR course examination and do not have an approved sickness/misadventure application for that course, the grades for the pair of units completed in that year will not contribute to the calculation of the achievement standard, but they will still count in the breadth-and-depth requirement. Students who do not sit the examination will not receive a course report.

Remember: it is the student's responsibility to read the information regarding examinations in the Year 12 Handbook which is available on the SCSA website. It is also the responsibility of the student to make sure they have all the required equipment for their examinations and that they bring a copy of their personalised examination timetable to the exams with them.

The ATAR students will be sitting their exams in Week 7 (19 - 21 November). A timetable will be released in Term 4, please note this is a reverse week and exams will run from Monday to Wednesday. Year 11 General students will also be sitting tests this week.



Term 3 is coming to an end, it has been a very busy Term. We are currently in the process of ensuring that we have collected all Boarding Away from Home Allowance forms so that we can deduct \$1,948 from each of your accounts. As you are aware, Boarding Away from Home Allowance comes direct to the College, therefore we collate all the information and disburse it to the Department.

We have sent home your final statement for 2018 in the last few days. The outstanding amount on your statement will need to be finalised promptly unless you have a formal payment plan arrangement in place. Please note Education Department Policy below:

Failure to clear all outstanding fees and charges from Year II can result in residency being denied at the commencement of the following year.

Any Year 11 students that are in credit will be rolled over to 2019 unless stated otherwise by the parent. Year 12 Students are quickly approaching the completion of their education. All accounts need to be cleared in full before they finish. Student projects will not be allowed to be collected unless they have been paid in full.

The 2019 Contributions and Charges Information booklet as well as the Booklist is in the process of being finalised and approved. These will be posted home early in December to ensure you have sufficient time to prepare for next year.
