# Fees & Charges 2023

## Fees Policy 2023

### ACCEPTANCE DEPOSIT

- A deposit of \$200.00 is payable upon receipt of an Offer of Acceptance from the WA College of Agriculture, Cunderdin.
- The \$200.00 deposit is credited to the Term One residential fees or meals for day students.
- The acceptance deposit is fully refunded in the event of a written withdrawal being received prior to the start of Term One.

### RESIDENTIAL BOARDING FEES

- The first and second instalments of residential fees must be cleared by the end of Semester One for students to continue in residence in Semester Two.
- The third instalment is to be cleared before the commencement of Term Three.

**Failure to clear all outstanding fees from Year 11 will result in residency being denied at the commencement of Year 12 unless prior repayment arrangements have been made with the Manager Corporate Services.**

NB: Students may attend the education programme in Year 12 as a day student.

### SUBJECT CHARGES & PERSONAL ITEMS

- These fees are to be paid as soon as possible after Induction Day (as per itemised invoice) unless arrangement has been made with the Manager Corporate Services.
- Course Charges, Extra Cost Options & Other Optional Costs are to be paid if your child participates. An invoice for these items will be forwarded when your child participates.

### REFUNDS

- If a student leaves the College through their own choice or through termination of residency, fees remain payable for the number of weeks the student has been in residence. Parents will be refunded the excess, if applicable, on a pro rata basis.
- If a student ceases the educational programme at the College, pro rata of charges less the percentage of Government Subsidy will be refunded to parents according to the time of the year in line with the Department of Education Fees Policies.

# General Information

## FEES & CHARGES STRUCTURE

Parents will be issued with an itemised invoice for their student's fees in February 2023, which will include: Boarding Fees, Subject Charges, Personal Items, Extra Cost Options and Other Optional Costs.

### BOARDING FEES

Boarding fees are levied by the Department of Education on an annual basis and reflect those charged by the Country Hostels Authority. To assist ease of payment these are divided into three instalments, payable at the beginning of each of the first three terms. In 2023 these fees will be \$9,069.00. Boarding fees are GST free.

***No student will be permitted to commence Year 12 as a residential student unless prior repayment arrangements have been made with the Manager Corporate Services to clear outstanding fees from the previous year.***

## STUDENT SERVICES/PASTORAL CARE/HEALTH & WELLBEING

These are levied to provide services to students in the College. These services assist in the emotional and physical care of your child.

### TEXTBOOK PURCHASES

Booklists will be forwarded to you as soon as they are available. Campion is the distributor for 2023 and ordering is direct to them, not through the College.

If you know any recent ex-student, some textbooks may be available from them secondhand. The College does not have any secondhand books for sale. Year 11 students will receive their books at induction and Year 12 students will receive their books in the first week of Term One.

### TRADES PROJECTS

Students will be able to commence a Trade project in Year 11. They will design and complete a cost estimation which will be sent home for approval by parents. 50% will need to be paid prior to commencement of the project, with final payment being made before the project can be collected. Students will only be charged for material used.

### DFES / FIRE ALARMS

There is a financial cost for any student involved or found to have instigated a FALSE ALARM. This charge will be forwarded to Parents/Guardians. Currently the charge is \$1,337.00 but may be subject to change.

## STUDENT DAMAGE TO COLLEGE PROPERTY

If a student recklessly or maliciously damages College property, they will be required to pay for the cost of the repair or replacement.

## SPECIALIST OPTIONAL COURSES

Additional costs for optional courses in Year 12 if chosen.

In previous years, the school has received funding to fully cover the cost of providing certificate III courses delivered through South Regional TAFE and/or Central Regional TAFE, however, this funding is being reduced and the TAFE's have been told to move to a "user pays" system. We will hopefully still be able to fully fund, or at least heavily subsidised these courses for next year, but in the interests of full disclosure, we are obliged to provide the full economic cost of these courses.

## PAYMENT IN PERSON AT BANK

It is imperative that you use the student number as the reference when depositing in the College account over the counter at a bank. With this method of payment, the only details that appear on the College statement is the name of the branch which the transaction has taken place at and the student number. If it is necessary for the College to request a voucher trace for the details of the payee, a \$13.50 fee is incurred which is the parents' responsibility to pay.

# Allowances & Payments

## COMMONWEALTH AND STATE ASSISTANCE

Boarding fees can be substantially reduced for families eligible for assistance through several State and Commonwealth Government schemes. An outline of these schemes follows, based on information available at the time of publication.

### ASSISTANCE FOR ISOLATED CHILDREN SCHEME (AIC)

AIC is a scheme provided by the Commonwealth Government which includes a basic boarding allowance and an additional boarding allowance to assist families with the costs of children boarding away from home to go to school.

The basic boarding allowance is indexed annually (\$8,856.00 for 2022) and is not means tested. It is available to children who:

- Are geographically isolated.
- Have a special education need.
- Have no reasonable access to a school.
- Meet a continuity condition.

The additional boarding allowance is subject to an income test and is indexed annually (up to \$2,540.00 from 1 January 2022 for students under the age of 16).

The AIC scheme is administered by Centrelink and paid directly to the family or the residential college. Please provide the College with a copy of your approval letter from Centrelink once it is available. Prices are subject to change at government discretion, please check with Centrelink. ### BOARDING AWAY FROM HOME ALLOWANCE (BAHA)

All recipients of the AIC boarding allowance or second home allowance are eligible for the State Government Boarding Away from Home Allowance (BAHA) of \$1,320.00.

This allowance is administered by the Department of Education and paid directly to the College.

### BOARDING AWAY FROM HOME ALLOWANCE (BAHA)

#### SPECIAL SUBSIDY

For students **not eligible** for AIC or Youth Allowance or Abstudy, a Student Boarding Away from Home Allowance (Special Subsidy) is available at the rate of \$1,320.00. Application forms will be sent to you from the College in 2023.

**All BAHA allowances are paid to the College in Term Four and upon receipt will be re-directed to parents, less any outstanding student fees and charges.**

# Allowances & Payments

## YOUTH ALLOWANCE

Depending upon parental income and family assets a student may receive a higher level of Commonwealth assistance if he or she is eligible for Youth Allowance.

In general, students 16 years and over should apply for Youth Allowance if they would receive more than they otherwise would under the AIC and BAHA.

Eligibility for the Away-from-Home rate of Youth Allowance for isolated secondary students is different from the AIC allowance criteria.

## ABSTUDY

Indigenous students can apply for ABSTUDY which assists with boarding, travel, and tuition costs of those eligible. ABSTUDY is administered by Centrelink and paid directly to the family or the College.

## STUDENT SUBSIDISED TRAVEL

The Student Subsidised Travel Scheme provides financial assistance for students who need to travel more than 56 km to attend a school or college. There are two main types of assistance:

- a fares allowance which may be payable to students who live in a Defined Remote Area (DRA)
- a road travel subsidy payable for students who live in the DRA.

Subsidised Student Travel is administered by the Department of Transport and paid directly to the family.

## SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME (SAS)

Allowances for the Educational Program (\$235.00) and Clothing (\$115.00) are available, subject to means test. Forms are available from the Administration office.

Centrelink Pensioner Concession / Centrelink Health Care / Department of Veteran Affairs Pensioner Concession Cards **MUST** be presented.

Claimants who satisfy the eligibility criteria will receive a cheque for \$115.00 from the Department of Education for the clothing component. The educational program component of \$235.00 will be sent to the College and deducted from College fees.
